First West-European get-together of telephone collectors

In Belgium there is no organized collectors club like THG or TCI, but all the collectors are known to each other and they co-operate in the transfer of information and ideas for the preservation of telephone history.

Leo De Boeck, the owner of a private telephone museum (www.leofoon.be) came up with the idea to organize a get-together of everybody who is involved in telephone history in Belgium. Jan Verhelst suggested inviting also people from the neighboring countries. Invitations were issued and thirty-two persons including twenty-three Belgians: (Fourteen collectors and nine partners) and nine people from neighboring countries three from Germany, two from the Netherlands, two from the UK, one from Ireland and one from France attended the get-together at the Leofoon museum at Steenhuffel, Belgium on August 31st, 2019.

People, who knew each other by mail, met each other for the first time in real life. Much was discussed and ideas were exchanged.

Andy Emmerson (UK) gave a demonstration of an electronic version of a speaking clock, with samples of a great number of speaking clock voices from all over the world. An ideal tool for every telephone museum, since the electromechanical speaking clocks are difficult to maintain in working order.

Frank Garnier (The Netherlands) gave an explanation about C*NET, the international telephone network superimposed on the internet, to connect telephone collectors worldwide.

Several international visitors were interested in visiting telephone museums and collectors in the neighborhood. In the days prior to the get-together, a guided tour to several museums was organized.
